## **COMPETITION CODE OF CONDUCT**

# Promoting Enjoyment, Fair Play, Respect & Honesty Updated – November 2018



### **Entering events:**

- All schools are invited to enter events through the competition email <u>csetprimarycompetition@cset.co.uk</u>
- It is essential that all schools enter the correct children in CSET events. We offer A, B, C & D team opportunities and information re: the standard of the competitors expected, is in the event information
- Once the closing date has passed all entries are collated and, if needed, further event information provided for participating schools

#### Pre-event organisation:

 Schools are expected to share all of the relevant competition information with parents e.g.: competition venue, parking and rules

#### On arriving at the event, teachers in charge of their teams need to sign in and provide:

- · Number of boys and girls attending
- Number of SEND and BAME children attending
- Name of the accompanying teacher and nominated adult/coach (these are the only adults allowed on the field of play)
- · Notification of Photo / Twitter Consent

#### Valuables:

• Please can all staff and pupils ensure that any valuables are kept in a locked or sealed bag and not left unattended at any time. The Partnership cannot take responsibility for schools' property

#### **Event Briefing:**

#### It is important that teachers attend the briefing on time. This will include:

- Delivery of basic safety information fire exits, toilets, first aid etc.
- Sign-in sheet check all data collected and remaining coach lanyards given out
- Outlining of the order of play, rules and designated spectator area for parents/spectators
   While the briefing is taking place the nominated adult/coach is to supervise the children

#### During an event it is expected that a participating school will:

- Be responsible for the conduct of their players, spectators and parents
- Ensure their parents/spectators are aware of the designated spectating area and that they remain within this area
- Encourage parents/spectators to praise all children / good play (their team and the opposition)
- Ensure that any query regarding a decision made by the referee or rule clarification is addressed to the event organiser by the teacher only
- Ensure coaching is only carried out by teachers and nominated accompanying staff /adult
- Encourage fair play and respect all participants to shake hands and /or 3 cheers to take place at the end of the game

#### **Conduct of Coaches and Teachers at event:**

- · Coaching is carried out in a professional and positive manner at all times
- Any query is addressed to the event organiser

Negative or abusive language and behaviour is not appropriate. If such language **or** behaviour is used by parents, staff or pupils of a school, a warning will be issued. If this warning is not adhered to, the event organiser has the right to abandon / suspend a game or in extreme cases disqualify the relevant school

The Referee / Event Organiser's decision is final
