Computing

E-Safety

During our E-safety unit, we will be learning how to create secure passwords in order to protect our private information and accounts online. Additionally, we will work together to outline common expectations in order to be good digital citizens; learn what spam is and then identify strategies for dealing with it and understand the importance of citing all sources when they do research. Properties and changes of materials
