E-Safety

During our E-safety unit, we will be learning how to create secure passwords in order to protect our private information and accounts online. Additionally, we will work together to outline common expectations in order to be good digital citizens; learn what spam is and then identify strategies for dealing with it and understand the importance of citing all sources when they do research. The unit will culminate in the class signing Digital Citizens Pledge to be upheld throughout the year.

Science

Properties and changes of materials

Through our science learning, children will be exploring thermal and electrical conductivity and grouping materials accordingly. Additionally, we will mixing and dissolving materials to investigate whether they form a mixture or if they can be separated using sieving, filtering or evaporation. Towards the end of the unit, we will be exploring reversible and irreversible changes and identifying if a chemical change has occurred.

Black History Week

What role did Bristol play in slavery and should Bristol apologise?

What influence do Martin Luther King, Sajid Javid, Barack Obama and Marvin Rees have?

During Black History Month, we will learn about key figures both locally and globally who have had a positive impact on the world.

Through this, we will explore the actions taken by Martin Luther King, Barack Obama in the USA, Sajid Javid and Marvin Rees in Bristol and examine their impact.

History

How have monarchs gained and used their power to rule?

We will learn about how Monarchs rose to power, kept power and think about whether we think they were responsible leaders. We will explore the monarchy from the earliest Anglo Saxon kingdoms, to the changing power of the monarchy, Henry VIII, and the legacy of Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth II. For each monarch, we explore changes in social history such as crime and punishment, leisure and entertainment.

Vocabulary: monarchy, society, power, Magna Carta, Normans, Bosworth Field, Tudors, Victorians, influence, absolute power, empire, government, figurehead, era, achievements, impact, legacy.
