Sound

Science

We will be exploring the unit of sound, identifying how sounds are made and recognising that vibrations from a sound travel through a medium to the ear. Through investigations, we will find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it. Using data loggers, we will recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases. This will link to our computing unit of work as well.

Life Learning

How can I show respect to others?

Through our second Jigsaw topic, the children will be exploring the importance of accepting people for who they are; understanding influences on their opinions; the significance of being a witness to bullying and finding strategies to help solve conflict. The topic will conclude in identifying and celebrating the uniqueness of everyone and revisiting the school's core theme of why it is important to respect people for who they are.

RE

SYNOPSIS

In our learning this term, we are focussing the Vikings, examining how they

successfully raided and analysing their legacy on modern Britain. This will

link to our visit from Clive Pig (an international storyteller) who ran a

drama workshop based on Viking sagas last term.

In addition, in computing, the children will consider how and why data is collected over time. Pupils will consider the senses that humans use to

experience the environment and how computers can use special input

devices called sensors to monitor the environment. Pupils will collect data as well as access data captured over long periods of time using data

loggers.

Why do some people think that life is like a journey?

Through our exploration of the Sikh and Christian faiths, children will be considering milestones in life and reflect on the reasons why celebrating these are important.

We will be learning about commitment in the Christian and Sikh faiths, and exploring how Christians and Sikhs express their faith and demonstrate ongoing commitment throughout life.

History

How did the Vikings change Britain?

We will be taking a voyage through history exploring why the Vikings raided Britain, the events in Lindisfarne and learning more about Alfred the Great. We will learn more about a peace treaty signed with the Viking Guthrum, and explore who was the first European to land in America. Was it Christopher Columbus in 1492?!
