Thinking as a writer	Light lyrics: Write a song about light. You can perform it if you wish.	Choose and research a famous Brazilian person (e.g Pele, Paulo Coelho) or famous landmark (e.g Christ the Redeemer, Sao Paulo cathedral) and create an information booklet.	Write a poem using metaphors to describe Scrooge from a Christmas Carol.	Write a balanced argument giving reasons for and against the destruction of the Amazon Rainforest.
Thinking as an artist	Sculpt it: Using only materials that reflect light make a sculpture of anything you wish. (Tip: materials could include tinfoil and old CDs)	Light snaps: Take some photographs which show/use light in an interesting way. (This could be natural or artificial light)	Research an artist from South America; tell us all about them and create your own piece of art using their style e.g. Omar Rayo	Make it: Make a musical instrument from a South American country
Thinking as a scientist	Bouncing spotlight You will need: ball, torch, mirror, dark room. Experiment: Place the ball in different parts of the room. Keeping the torch in one place can you move the mirror so that the light can always shine on the ball? Write up your findings including diagrams.	Back to front: Can you write a message that when reflected in a mirror will make sense?	Shiny spoons: When you look into the back of a spoon your reflection is upside down. Why is that? Why do your eyes see it this way? Present your findings in any way you wish.	Choose six living organisms found in the Amazon Rainforest, create a branching database to classify them.
